Spiritual Direction (Spiritual Companionship) at Bergamo

Spiritual Direction (also referred to as Spiritual

Companionship or Accompaniment) is a spiritual practice developed in relationship by meeting regularly with a spiritual director. This companionship inspires people to experience authenticity in their lives as they connect with and explore their relationship with God. The purpose is to deepen one's spirituality and growth, paying ever closer attention to what God is inviting you to. God is the real director in the relationship. The spiritual companion is a professionally trained, active companion who helps you to recognize, appreciate, and be attentive to the movement of God in your life.



Etched into a plaque in the main hallway of the Bergamo Center for Lifelong Learning is the description that Bergamo was founded "to educate people of all ages and from all walks of life to appreciate their full human potential and their social responsibility to the human community." It is with this same spirit of renewal, education, ecumenism, and commitment to the common good that Bergamo welcomes groups of all ages to *deepen self-awareness, develop the interior life*, and *elicit a personal and communal faith response to changing times*. These three invitations can be explored through spiritual direction.

Spiritual directors (also called spiritual companions) are trained in the art of listening and accompaniment. Meeting with a spiritual companion provides the opportunity to prayerfully reflect on your life, God's presence with you, and how you may be called to respond to God and those around you in your daily life.

Meeting with a spiritual director may be especially helpful for you if you are:

- desiring a prayerful space to "unpack" all that is happening in your life
- seeking to deepen your relationship with God
- hoping to explore new ways of prayer
- looking for accompaniment to discern the call of the Holy Spirit
- experiencing a crossroads or life transition

Faces of Bergamo: Meet Fr. Gene Contadino!

Please tell us about yourself.

I was born in Cincinnati, OH, to parents who valued Catholic education — a fact that made all of the difference in my life! I attended Purcell High School, which is where I was first introduced to the Marianists and entered the Society of Mary at the age of 18. Later, in ministering at the University of Dayton, I held several positions among the staff, on the faculty, and in administration. Carrying the Marianist charism allowed me to bring that value-added quality to our many coworkers and students.



I also served as pastor of St. Francis de Sales parish in Cincinnati for 10 years. Working at this thriving Marianist parish and school had challenges that are present in urban schools, but it was an experience filled with warmth, positivity, and a spirit of family.

How have you been involved with Bergamo/the Mount Saint John property?

I have been involved with Bergamo and the Mount Saint John campus in numerous ways over the years. As a student at UD, I did dishes here! I worked at the Queen of Apostles Church from 1977 to 1983, and one summer I even lived in the basement of Bergamo (where a Marianist community previously resided)! I have attended many wonderful and significant Marianist events and retreats here over the years, and I have served on the Board of Trustees since 2021.

What is a highlight of your involvement at Bergamo?

My perpetual vow retreat was on the property and was a significant and memorable event in my life.

What are your hopes for Bergamo's guests and for the organization?

I am currently excited about working with Kelli Kinnear, Bergamo's new executive director (since June 2024), and the enthusiasm she brings to the organization.

I have many hopes for Bergamo and for all those who come here. I hope that high

school retreatants have a seed planted that will blossom in their hearts. I hope everyone who comes here is renewed and refreshed. I hope their time here encourages them to pay attention to the planet, to the universe even, and their connection to it. In the Spirit of Pope Francis, I hope they sharpen not only their religious attention, but their attention to the earth. Bergamo is not just a place to get away from life, but a place to get into life, and have a more meaningful existence.

Bergamo Faith-Sharing Group Recap

This spring, Bergamo sponsored an adult faith formation program for the first time in recent years.

The Bergamo Lenten faith-sharing group consisted of 7 adults of different ages who met weekly to prayerfully reflect on and share about their weeks and pray with scripture. Each week a participant also shared a longer account of their faith journey, namely, the ups and downs in their lives and how they have seen God working through these experiences. Multiple times, the given faith journey led to such fruitful discussion that the group ran out of time to do the other scheduled prayer activity! The group also participated in a daylong retreat, led by Brendan Dillon and Bergamo-affiliated spiritual directors Joe McHugh and Stephen Rivet, who guided the group through different prayer experiences including lectio divina, visio divina, and "Emmaus walks."

The weekly sessions were facilitated by Brendan Dillon, Bergamo's Guest Services Coordinator, who hoped that bringing together adults of all ages would allow participants to share wisdom and perspectives from different life stages. Kyle, one of the participants, expressed his appreciation of this aspect: "I was initially skeptical about the intergenerational emphasis, but as we began to share our individual faith journeys, our connections transcended the age gaps and we bonded over our collective desire to grow deeper in our relationships with God. We grew together, and that was very special."
