## Spotlight on World's Greatest Retreat



With a retreat theme like World's Greatest it begs some questions...What are the origins of this retreat? And come on, really...Who can boast that this is the "World's Greatest Retreat"?

Bergamo Youth Program director Kevin Kozlowski explains the *World's Greatest* retreat was started in the year 2002 by Christi Dodson, Youth Minister at St. Patrick, Troy; Kathy Shirley from Our Lady of Mercy, Dayton; and Kevin Kozlowski, who was then the youth group leader at Sacred Heart, New Carlisle and their respective youth groups. The team of High School students involved in the planning the event were seeking a theme song that could be used to set the tone of the retreat.

At one of the team meetings a young lady named Emily Hibbits presented R&B singer R. Kelly's - *World's Greatest* as the theme. In Emily's presentation she began with a reading from Genesis 1:27, "**And He created Man in His image and divine an image it was.**" Emily suggested the song should remind us that we are the only inhabitants of this planet that are made in the image of God, so that means we are the greatest gifts to this earth and we should respect the earth, respect all life, respect each other, and make the choices in our lives likewise.

The theme was truly embraced even as much as addressing the retreatants as not just ex. *Joe Jones*...but as, "Hey, World's Greatest Joe Jones." After the retreat ended the goal was to encourage others to affirm the world through their schools, churches, and communities that we are all the greatest gifts to this earth.

The next year the Bergamo Center was booked again for the retreat and the question of a new theme came up. It was Christi Dodson who said, "No, we keep that theme! The retreat has become quite popular and the numbers have increased over time.
