# Celebrating Pope St. John XXIII and Bergamo!

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was born in a small village near the city of Bergamo, Italy. Many Bergamo Center visitors might recognize his last name as the name of Bergamo's chapel! Angelo took the name "John XXIII" when he was elected pope in 1958. He convened the Second Vatican Council in 1962, where he famously sought to "Throw open the windows of the church and let the fresh air of the spirit blow through." The Bergamo Center was founded in this spirit, and Pope St. John XXIII is the organization's patron saint.

In honor of his feast day, we similarly want to throw open the windows of Bergamo and invite people to celebrate and support our retreat center while having fun and building community!

We will begin the evening at 5pm with a prayer service, followed by some information about Bergamo and fun surprises. We will share a delicious dinner at 6:15pm, and we will conclude the evening with time for socializing!

### Faces of Bergamo: Meet Fr. Thomas-Mary Gilbert!

Fr. Thomas-Mary creates breathtaking icons, including the ones pictured in this article. Learn more about him and his artistic inspirations below.

Please tell us about yourself.

My name is Fr Thomas-Mary Gilbert, O.C.D., and I am a Discalced

Carmelite Friar. I live at the Shrine of Mary, Help of Christians at Holy Hill in Wisconsin, where I minister to pilgrims who come to our large shrine. I also take courses at the University of Dayton for a certificate in Mariology and use the Marian Library for research.

How have you been involved with Bergamo/the Mount Saint John property?

For the last year, I have been coming to Bergamo for a week or two at a time when I take courses. At Bergamo, I research, study, and enjoy the retreat atmosphere.





Can you tell us more about your icons and your process for creating them?

I got into iconography some years ago when I lived in Washington D.C. and would learn about icons from a professor at an icon studio.

The icon with Mary surrounded by flowers (above) is called Mary, the Unfading Flower. I used the resources of the International Marian Research Institute (IMRI), part of the University of Dayton, to learn about Marian flowers. There is a listing from the Middle Ages with hundreds of flowers,

and they are all related to Mary's life and virtues. Ancient icons inspire me, and this icon takes some of the elements seen in the ancient ones, but it is original in that it has a wide array of Marian flowers. Each flower is related to Mary's life in some way, and many of the flowers are native to Wisconsin, where I live. Mary is crowned by Jesus and this evokes the delight of a May crowning. IMRI sponsors a Marian Forum, and next March, I hope to be involved in sharing my research and work.

The other icon that has been featured by IMRI is Mary, Mother and Teacher in the Spirit (below). Mary teaches us receptivity and docility to the Holy Spirit. Her hands are perfectly conformed to the dove representing the Holy Spirit. A card was made by IMRI and it was distributed at Bergamo.

## What is a highlight of your involvement at Bergamo?

I stayed at Bergamo this past Spring and I particularly enjoyed the beautiful flowers and the Lourdes Grotto. In Springtime, Bergamo is bright with color and vitality.

What are your hopes for Bergamo's guests and the organization?

I hope that others discover the Marian atmosphere of Bergamo and come to a deeper appreciation of prayer, solitude, and formation that resonate with Marianist spirituality.
