## **Ordination of Bob Jones**

The Bergamo Center has had the honor and pleasure of hosting Marianist Directors who are in Dayton this weekend for the ordination of Bob Jones, SM. We also welcome the family of Bob Jones who will be joining us for brunch following the 2<sup>nd</sup> mass celebrated by Rev. Jones on Sunday, Oct. 4.

### **The Origins of Jubilee**

The word jubilee derives from the Hebrew "jobel" and refers to the blast of the shofar on the Day of Atonement. We read in part about the ancient practice of a holy year in the Book of Leviticus:



You shall treat this fiftieth year as sacred. You shall proclaim liberty in the land for all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you, when each of you shall return to your own property, each of you to your own family. This fiftieth year is your year of jubilee; you shall not sow, nor shall you reap the aftergrowth or pick the untrimmed vines, since this is the jubilee. It shall be sacred for you. You may only eat what the field yields of itself. (25:10-12)

The first Christian jubilee was instituted by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300—the same year in which Dante Alighieri set his magnum opus The Divine Comedy whose reading has been recommended by Pope Francis for the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy beginning in 2015.

### **Jubilee of Mercy**

Pope Francis has declared 2016 to be a Jubilee Year of Mercy. A number of opportunities for reflection and recollection are planned at the Bergamo Center.

On the Marianist World Day of Prayer on Oct. 11, which is also the Feast of Saint Pope John XXIII, from 6-8 pm at the Center, Jubilee Retreat Guide Anthony Franchina will lead particpants in a
