At Bergamo the retreat is finished, and I stand alone and reflect in the Roncalli Chapel and take a moment to breathe. Though the facilitation team and I do 40+ retreats a year, this one was unique. It involved seventy youth from all over the Southwestern Ohio area sharing smiles, tears, joy, and faith.

The retreat was called "World's Greatest." Its theme is a recognition of Genesis 1:27 - "So God created man in His image, and divine an image it was." The theme: God's plan for us was to take His love and grace to each other...we were the worlds' greatest



gifts and are called to a responsibility for the preservation of care and love for the earth.

As our Blessed William Joseph Chaminade has said, "Let us always tend to the pure love of God and to the profound contempt of ourselves, and the Holy Spirit will enable us to work wonders."

The Youth Program at Bergamo hosted 12 schools this past year. In the 2020/21 school year we hosted 49 retreats during the year. We work with close to 2000 students a year. We have 45 college student volunteers to lead. All of the schools returned the next year and praised our ability to work around the pandemic.



Parish Beacons of Light

Beacons of Light is a multi-year process of pastoral planning for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Groupings of parishes will come together as one faith community. These new "Families of Parishes" will be stronger, with the resources to focus more on mission than on maintenance.



Through Beacons of Light Families of Parishes will be implemented throughout the cities and towns, suburbs and rural communities of the 19 counties in western and southwestern Ohio. Pastors and parish leaders will then plan for the future of their Family of Parishes, growing closer to God, following Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit and radiating Christ throughout our lives.

Bergamo Center offers to these parish Families of the Archdiocese a common sacred holy ground in the Dayton area for Parishes to meet and gather together for planning in the future.

Providing this common safe reflective space on the grounds of Mount Saint John is the Marianists offer to assist the Catholic church in the Archdiocese for representative members of any Parish Families to gather to build relationships.

Bergamo's Retreat and Conference meeting space, dining services and 60 newly remodeled hotel like bedrooms offer the kind of experience where a vision for the future can take place.
